

## BSB41415 – CERTIFICATE IV IN WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY

This qualification is suitable for people working in a Work Health and Safety (WHS) role who work to provide leadership and guidance to others and have some limited responsibility for the output of others.

The qualification reflects the role of workers who apply a broad knowledge base and well developed skills in a wide variety of contexts and may include coordinators, advisors and facilitators.



**Entry Requirements** - There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

**Language, literacy and numeracy requirements** - This unit requires the ability to read; interpret various documents and then communicate information to others. Writing is required to the level of completing required workplace reports/forms. Numeracy may involve the reading of instruments/gauges and interpret the results as being safe/not safe.

**Duration** - This qualification is generally conducted in block training sessions over a 5 -10 days. There is also additional assignments to be completed in your own time. You are allowed an additional 12 months in which to complete and submit these assignments.

**Delivery Location** - This training is generally conducted on site at client premises, however some units may be suitable for delivery at our training facility. Where training is held onsite, training rooms that can comfortably accommodate the class size are required.

### Personal Protective Equipment

- Covered shoes
- Other requirements as specified by your workplace or legislation, or the elective units chosen



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**Assessment** - The assessment will consist of written and practical activities and written and practical assessment.

**Certification** - Upon successful completion each participant will receive a nationally recognised Certificate IV in Work Health and Safety. A statement of Attainment may also be issued for each unit as it is completed, upon request.

**Qualification Packaging** - The following are the packaging rules for this qualification, followed by the list of relevant units of competency. Participants must successfully complete ten(10) units of competency made up of:

- Five (5) Core units, and five (5) elective units of which:
- At least three (3) units chosen from group A electives listed below
- The remaining two (2) units may be from Group A, Group B or any currently endorsed Training Package or accredited course at the same qualification level
- If not listed below, one (1) elective unit may be selected from a Certificate III or Diploma from any currently endorsed Training Package or accredited course.

Elective units must be relevant to the work environment and the qualification, maintain the integrity of the AQF alignment and contribute to a valid, industry-supported vocational outcome.
