

HLTAID003 PROVIDE FIRST AID

INCORPORATING

HLTAID001 PROVIDE CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION

This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty. The unit applies to all workers who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.



You will learn about:

- State/Territory regulations, first aid codes of practice and workplace procedures including:
 - ARC Guidelines relevant to provision of CPR and first aid
 - safe work practices to minimise risks and potential hazards
 - infection control principles and procedures, including use of standard precautions
 - requirements for currency of skill and knowledge
- legal, workplace and community considerations including:
 - awareness of potential need for stress-management techniques and available support following an emergency situation
 - duty of care requirements
 - respectful behaviour towards a casualty

- own skills and limitations
- consent

- importance of debriefing
- considerations when providing first aid including:
 - airway obstruction due to body position
 - appropriate duration and cessation of CPR
 - appropriate use of an AED
 - chain of survival
 - standard precautions
 - how to conduct a visual and verbal assessment of the casualty
- principles and procedures for first aid management for a variety of conditions

Entry Requirements - There are no pre requisites for this course.

Language, literacy and numeracy requirements – Language skills need to be adequate enough so that the First Aider can communicate with Emergency Services. Written skills sufficient for preparation of written incident report or provide information to enable preparation of an incident report.

Duration - Typically this course is conducted over 1 day, with some pre-course study required.

Delivery Location - This training can be conducted at either your premises or at our training centre. Where training is held onsite training rooms that can comfortably accommodate the class size are required.
