

RII30715 – CERTIFICATE III IN MINE EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND RESCUE

This qualification reflects the role of Response and Rescue Team Members who work in a mine or a construction site. Usually the team members will perform tasks involving a broad range of skilled applications in a wide variety of contexts. Team members will need to apply some discretion and judgement in selecting equipment, services or contingency measures.



This training is specifically tailored to suit the requirements of your Emergency Response Team (ERT) and organisation; the training is highly practical and is generally conducted at your site. Prior to the commencement of this training, Safety and Emergency Trainings' (SET) Emergency Response trainers will work closely with your site to understand the equipment available, site work procedures and potential incidents. The practical training scenarios will be tailored to your site providing your ERT members with a realistic hand on experience.

Entry Requirements - There are no entry requirements for this qualification. Depending on the elective units chosen, there may be some prerequisite or co requisite units that will need to also be delivered if not already held by the candidate. If they are not held, SET will incorporate delivery into the training and assessment strategy.

Language, literacy and numeracy requirements - This unit requires the ability to read; interpret various documents and then communicate information to others. Writing is required to the level of completing required workplace reports/forms. Numeracy may involve the reading of instruments/gauges and interpret the results as being safe/not safe.



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Duration - This qualification is generally conducted in block training sessions over a 6 - 12 month period. Training duration will be advised after selection of elective units and in consideration of pre-requisite units for these elective units requiring delivery.

Delivery Location - This training is generally conducted on site at client premises, however some units may be suitable for delivery at our training facility. Where training is held onsite, training rooms that can comfortably accommodate the class size are required.

Personal Protective Equipment

- Long work pants and high visibility shirt
- Covered shoes
- Hard hat and safety glasses
- Other requirements as specified by your workplace or legislation, or the elective units chosen

Assessment - The assessment will consist of written and practical activities and written and practical assessment.

Certification - Upon successful completion each participant will receive a nationally recognised Certificate III in Mine Emergency Response and Rescue. A statement of Attainment will also be issued for each unit completed at each training block.

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Qualification Packaging - The following are the packaging rules for this qualification, followed by the list of relevant units of competency. Participants must successfully complete sixteen (16) units of competency made up of:

- Four (4) Core units, and twelve (12) elective units of which:
- one (1) must be chosen from group A electives listed below
- at least eight (8) must come from the group B electives listed below
- one (1) may be chosen from group C electives below
- up to two (2) units may be chosen from elsewhere within this training package, or form another training package or accredited course.

Units of competency chosen must be relevant to the job function.
