

TLILIC2001A – LICENCE TO OPERATE A FORKLIFT TRUCK

This unit specifies the outcomes required for the operation of a powered industrial truck equipped with a mast and an elevating load carriage to which is attached a pair of fork arms or other attachment, for licensing purposes. This definition also includes a truck on which the operator is raised with the attachment for order-picking. This unit requires the operator to be able plan the work, conduct routine checks on the forklift, shift loads in a safe manner, and shut down and secure the equipment after the completion of operations.



It is based on the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work and in its current form meets state and territory licensing requirements. On satisfactory completion of theory and practical assessments, an application can be made to your relevant State or Territory for a High Risk Work Licence or an endorsement on any existing High Risk Work Licence that made be held.

You will learn about:

- Methodology of determining the weight of a load
- Commonwealth, state or territory OH&S legislation, standards relevant to the safe operation for the forklift trucks
- Understanding of forklift characteristics and capabilities (including use of load data plates)
- Understanding of the hierarchy of hazard identification and control

- Organisational and workplace standards, requirements, policies and procedures for conducting operations for the crane class
- Procedures for the recording, reporting and maintenance of workplace records and information
- Forklift truck operations and safe operating techniques
- Typical routine problems encountered in the operation of the crane and equipment and adjustments required for correction

Entry Requirements – There are no pre requisites for this unit.

Language, literacy and numeracy requirements - Sufficient language skills to be able to communicate with others in a clear and concise manner. Enough literacy skills to be able to read and comply with work instructions and specifications.

Duration – 1 – 1.5 days (Formal training only)

Upon completion of formal training, participants will be issued with a log book so that they may log practical training hours under supervision of a licenced ticket holder. Once sufficient hours have been logged and /or trainee is considered competent by supervisor and themselves, assessments can be conducted usually over the course of a day. The nominal hours for this unit are 40 hours.

Delivery Location - This training can be conducted at either your premises or at our training centre. Where training is held, onsite training rooms that can comfortably accommodate the class size are required.
